What is an athenæum?

The word *athenæum* (pronounced a·thuh·nee·uhm) is derived from Athena, the Greek goddess of wisdom. In 1731, Benjamin Franklin founded the Library Company of Philadelphia, a membership library that pooled the resources of multiple readers, and the idea spread worldwide. Of the thousands of membership libraries that flourished in America in the nineteenth century, fewer than twenty survive. However, the membership library's purpose remains the same: to encourage self-improvement and promote intellectual curiosity. 
